

## Bar councils produce voters not lawyers

I usually like to sit in Laburn High Court Bar with my friends and colleagues and get the historical background. The Bar Councils are statutory bodies responsible for safeguarding the rights, interests and privileges of practicing lawyers for regulating their conduct and helping the administration of justice. Its composition, powers and functions are described in detail by the Legal Practitioners and the Councils Act, 1971. Important role assigned to the Councils is to promote the legal education and ethics to newly registered advocates, and particularly to issue the licenses for the practice of law strictly in accordance with the provisions of the Act. It is also primary duty of the Councils to act upon these rules and regulations that control the Bar activities.
